Discussion Starters:

Talk about these scenarios with your child—(You've tried the math homework problem three	
different times, and you still can't get an answer. What should you do? If you're on the swim	
team, and you come in last in your race, what would be a reasonable goal to set for your next	
race? Your soccer coach wants you to practice dribbling, and you'd rather score goals. How	
could you show perseverance in soccer?)	
rainstorm ways that students can show perseverance in school, at home, or in their	
community.	
Beethoven was deaf, Stevie Wonder is blind, James Earl Jones was a stutterer, Helen Kelle	
was deaf and blind, and Thomas Edison had a learning problem. What role did perseverance	
play in helping these people achieve their goals?	
As a parent, talk about difficult situations you've faced and how you handled them without	
giving up. Share with your child what you've learned from those experiences.	
What would doing your best look like if you were: Cleaning your room? Learning something	
new, like playing an instrument? Studying for a test in a subject your found difficult? Getting	
tired in the middle of a job you were doing? Helping to organize a party? Setting goals for	
yourself?	
Read Aesop's <i>The Tortoise and the Hare</i> and talk about which character showed perseverance.
